CURRENT EMPLOYMENT

March 2015 ongoing Consultant Physician Acute Medical Unit West Suffolk Hospital Bury St Edmunds

I act as a consultant physician working 3-5 days most weeks with full time working during periods of escalation and other staff leave. This post involves the assessment of a wide range of serious medical emergencies in adult and elderly patients. Whilst most emergencies are medical in nature I also see cases which include trauma, surgical problems, orthopaedic and psychiatric emergencies. In addition to working in the acute medical unit, I also spend periods working in other areas of the hospital seeing general medical and geriatric patients.

August 2002

I took early retirement from the NHS in order to concentrate on medico-legal work and to progress what is currently a significant business interest. I left the NHS in good standing following the sale of my interest in what at the time was a very large medico-legal reporting organisation.
I am also the co-founder (in 2002) of a large occupational health company (corazonhealth.co.uk).

Recent Clinical

Since leaving the NHS I have regularly undertaken weekly non stipended clinical sessions in cardiology and medicine of the elderly. I have also assessed large numbers of medico-legal claimants with mainly musculo skeletal issues.

Appendix B

Medico-legal work

I have been undertaking medico-legal work since shortly after I was first appointed as a consultant physician in 1987. Whilst I mainly undertake claimant work I have also on many occasions undertaken defendant and joint reporting work.

As well as undertaking civil cases, I will also consider accepting instructions in criminal and legal aid funded cases. My main consulting base is just outside Cambridge but I have access to a number of other consulting facilities around Essex and East Anglia. Additionally in suitable cases I would be prepared to travel within England in order to assess claimants. I have undertaken a number of prison visits and if required I would be prepared to visit clients in custody.

I have received training in medico-legal work from Bond Solon and I have completed the MoJ MedCo course in personal injury reporting. Additionally I have attended various meetings of the Expert witness Institute and I am a member of the Academy of Experts. I regularly attend the annual Cambridge Medico-Legal Conference and the regular meetings of the Cambridge Medico-Legal Forum.
